

And since you gave generously to last year's <u>Linda Fund</u>, Affogato's costs were no concern.



## **Donor-Advised Devotion: DAFs Save C-A-T-S!**

If your kind heart yearns to help as many cats as possible, three little letters can help you save lives.

A Donor-Advised Fund (DAF) is an investment account designed to support the causes you love and gain tax advantages.

- You can contribute cash, stock, or other assets to a DAF, making it a flexible way to give.
- You receive a tax deduction as soon as you put funds in your DAF. When

you're ready to donate, you simply notify the financial institution, and they send a check to the charity of your choice.

- Any growth in your DAF is tax-free, so you will have more funds available to help the cats.
- A DAF helps you to be strategic about your giving, planning your most generous gifts around important

### LINDA FUND CHAMPION: Charles by Dr. Laura Collins, Veterinarian

This summer, the Linda Fund helped to treat our cherished Charles for a disease that was once inevitably fatal: FIP.

Feline Infectious Peritonitis (FIP) is a viral disease caused by feline enteric coronavirus (FeCV). As many as 50-90% of cats test positive for FeCVspecific antibodies (including big cats in zoos). The virus is shed in saliva and feces and spreads easily through close contact. About 90% of infected cats will be asymptomatic or have mild bouts of diarrhea or upper respiratory signs. In the remaining 10%, however, the coronavirus mutates into the much more serious FIP.

Early <u>symptoms</u> of FIP are notoriously vague, including lethargy and fluctuating fever. After several days to a few weeks, cats may display signs of either "wet" FIP (including fluid accumulation in the abdomen or chest cavity), or "dry" FIP (which may cause inflammation in one or more organs, or such ocular signs as swollen third eyelids). Untreated, cats <u>typically</u> <u>succumb</u> to the disease within days to months.

Until a few years ago, there was no treatment for FIP, and it was uniformly fatal. But in 2022, a treatment became available in Australia and the U.K., bringing the survival rate to 86% - and up to 96% if the cat survived the first 2 days!

In June 2024, this almost miraculous medication, called <u>GS-</u> <u>441524</u>, became available in the United

States. Around the same time, our own Charles developed "wet" FIP.

Charles was noted to be losing weight and acting lethargic. On physical examination, his abdomen seemed distended, and he had a fever. Charles is also infected with feline leukemia virus (FeLV), and he was fading fast.

We rushed him to the emergency vet for intensive care, and to begin the treatment. Time was of the essence, since some cats succumb to FIP before the medication can take effect. But 24 hours after his first pill, sweet Charles was fever free and eating!

FIP has gone from a disease that I dreaded diagnosing, to a disease that I can cure in the vast majority of cases.

Tragically, gentle Charles developed lymphoma, unrelated to FIP, later this summer. We treasured every day with our little marmalade king, grateful that this new FIP treatment bought him <u>one last summer</u> of health and happiness.



### Forever Loved: Antin Jonathan Rosenberg, Founder & Executive Director

When I first laid eyes on <u>Antin</u>, I saw a large, handsome tuxedo, eager for attention ... and, paralyzed. Within 10 seconds, my heart had developed a crack, and a flood of poignant tenderness overcame me. I wanted nothing more than for him to be happy.

And, he was happy, despite the awkward, and fixed, positioning of his rear legs. We never determined



the reason for his paralysis, but it caused him constant problems, as he developed sores on his legs as he dragged himself around..

Antin never complained, but we spent many hours attempting to alleviate the sores. Nothing worked well, but everything helped for a time. He wanted nothing more than some human attention. Fortunately, he was in the Lobby, where affection was abundant.

As we monitored Antin, we could see that something besides paralysis was involved. He developed proctitis<sup>1</sup>, and his rear legs were becoming muscle wasted. We have had many paraplegic cats, but this was new to us. Even our best specialist vets could not find a cause, or a way to stop the progression.

While Antin remained happy, the crack in my heart widened, with a yearning beyond words.

Eventually, Antin's conditions worsened to the point where we knew it was time to let him go. I was out of town and couldn't be with him during his last moments on earth. This added



to my heartbreak.

I was comforted knowing that he was cherished and left peacefully. But the crack in my heart will never heal. I still see him looking expectantly out of his carrier when he first arrived. I hope he knew how much he was loved.

But when someone you love is aching, you run to their side, no questions asked. And that's exactly what you did, by giving to the <u>Linda</u> <u>Fund</u>.


Last year's <u>Linda Fund</u> provided for Cassie's surgery. The enchanting cat prevailed over pain, once and for all.


